THIS NOTICE DESCRIBES HOW INFORMATION ABOUT YOU MAY BE USED AND DISCLOSED AND HOW YOU CAN GET ACCESS TO THIS INFORMATION. PLEASE REVIEW IT CAREFULLY.

Protecting Your Privacy

Protecting your privacy and your Protected Health Information is at the core of our business. We recognize our obligation to keep your information secure and confidential whether on paper or the Internet. Family Institute for Recovery & Empowerment, LLC (hereinafter referred to as "Family Institute"), privacy is one of our highest priorities.

Keeping Your Information

Keeping the Protected Health Information we have about you secure is one of our most important responsibilities. We value your trust and will handle your information with care. Our employees access information about you only when necessary to provide treatment, confirm eligibility, obtain authorization, process claims and otherwise meet your needs. We may also access information about you when considering a request from you or when exercising our rights under the law or any agreement with you. We safeguard information during all business practices according to established security standards and procedures, and we continually assess new technology for protecting information. Our employees are trained to understand and comply with these information principles.

Working To Meet Your Needs Through Information

In the course of doing business, we collect and use various types of information, like name and address and claims information. We use this information to provide service to you, to process your claims and to bring your health information that might be of interest to you.

Keeping Information Accurate

Keeping your health information accurate and up-to-date is very important. If you believe the health information we have about you is incomplete, inaccurate or not current, please call or write us at the telephone numbers or addresses listed below. We take appropriate action to correct any erroneous information as quickly as possible through a standard set of practices and procedures.

How - And Why - Information Is Shared

We limit who receives information and what type of information is shared.

1. *Sharing information within Family Institute:* We share information within our company to deliver you the services specified in your treatment or service plan.
2. *Sharing information with companies or independent contractors that work for us:* To help us offer you our services, we may share information with others that work for us, such as claim processing and mailing companies and Independent contractors that deliver services directly to you. These individuals act on our behalf and are obligated contractually to keep the information that we provide them confidential.
3. *Other.* Client-specific personally identifiable data is released only when required to provide a service for you and only to those with a need to know or with your consent. We will share information with your family and friends that per your request are involved in your treatment and government and other health care agencies (covered entities) currently involved in your treatment. Information is released with the condition that the person receiving the data will not release it further, unless you give permission. If we receive a subpoena or similar legal process demanding release of any information about you, we will attempt to notify you (unless we are prohibited from doing so). Except as required by law or as described above, we do not share information with other parties, including government agencies. Family Institute does not share any customer information with third-party marketers who offer their products and services to our clients.



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Count On Our Commitment To Your Privacy

You can count on us to keep you informed about how we protect your privacy and limit the sharing of information you provide to us - whether it's at our office, over the phone or through the Internet.

You may file a complaint about our privacy policies. If you think your privacy rights have been violated by us or you want to complain about our privacy practices, you may file a complaint with Family Institute by contacting either Executive Director or Clinical Director of the program you or your child participates in. If you file a complaint, we will not take any action against you or retaliate against you in any way.
